MONDAY, OCT 2

Welcome to the sandy shores of Cape Cod! Extending 70 miles into the sea, the Cape is home to both natural beauty and quaint colonial villages. You can walk pristine beaches, revel in the arts and culture, and reclaim childhood memories of seashells, sand castles, and saltwater taffy. TUESDAY, OCTOBER 3

8:30am - Your local guide will take you on a tour of **Hyannis**: John F. Kennedy Memorial, St. Andrews-by-the-Sea, the historic Kennedy Compound, Squaw Island, and more.

The seas and the shores of Hyannis Port inspired our 35th president like no other place on earth. It was her that he contemplated and accepted his run for office. Discover why he loved this place so, and how he spent his home on the Cape.

Spend free time having lunch and shopping on Main Street.

Chatham Village

Next we travel to the south side of the Cape to the seaside village at the elbow of the Cape. View the Chatham Light, a beacon for sailors throughout the Cape's history. The location of the elbow makes it vulnerable to winter storms. Your guide will point out the Chatham break and the dramatic changes to the shoreline that have occurred thanks to Mother Nature.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4

We travel to Plymouth, home of our Pilgrim fathers and one of the country's first settlements. We will take picture stops at the Forefather's Monument, the largest solid granite monument in the US and at Plymouth Rock. View the newly restored Mayflower II, a reproduction of the ship that brought the Pilgrims to the New World.

Board a Lobster Tales Cruise to learn about the creatures that live in Plymouth Harbor. See how lobsters are harvested, and roll up your sleeves to help haul in the lobster traps.

Lunch on your own on the waterfront.

Sandwich, the oldest town on the Cape. View the village green, the great salt marsh, cranberry bog, and the bay. Sandwich is home to one of America's largest glass factories. Tour the Sandwich Glass Museum with sparkling exhibits describing the transformation of a farming community to one of the world's most respected manufacturers of 198th century glass. Watch glass blowers make exquisite shapes. Visit the museum gift shop.

Dinner buffet included tonight at the Historic Dan'l Webster Inn, serving patrons for more than 300 years.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 5

Travel on historic Route 6A, Old King's Highway, See hundreds of historic structures characterizing its early development. View windmills, lighthouses, and visit the National Seashore Visitor's Center. Sand dunes and ocean surround you as you approach Land's End - Provincetown. Take time to enjoy the wonderful variety of shops, restaurants, and galleries that make this village so unique.
